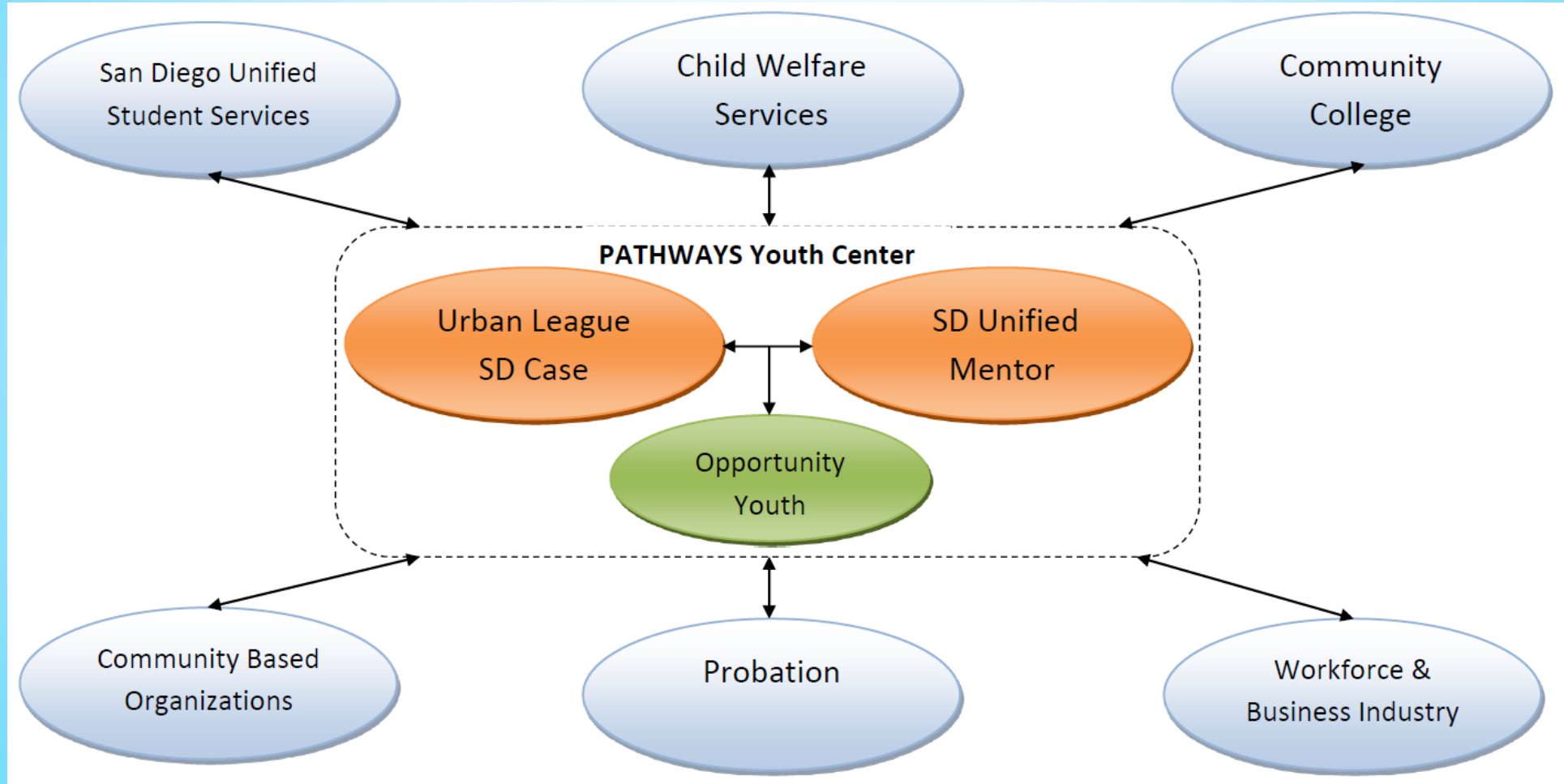

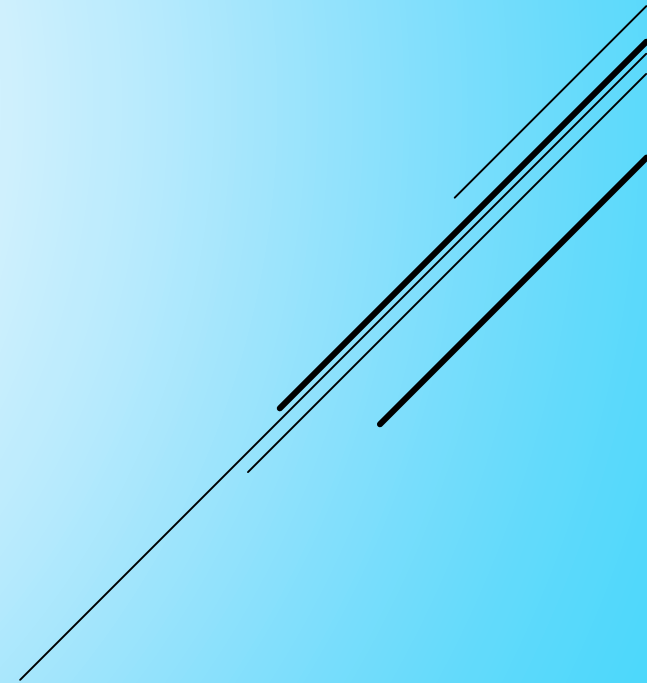




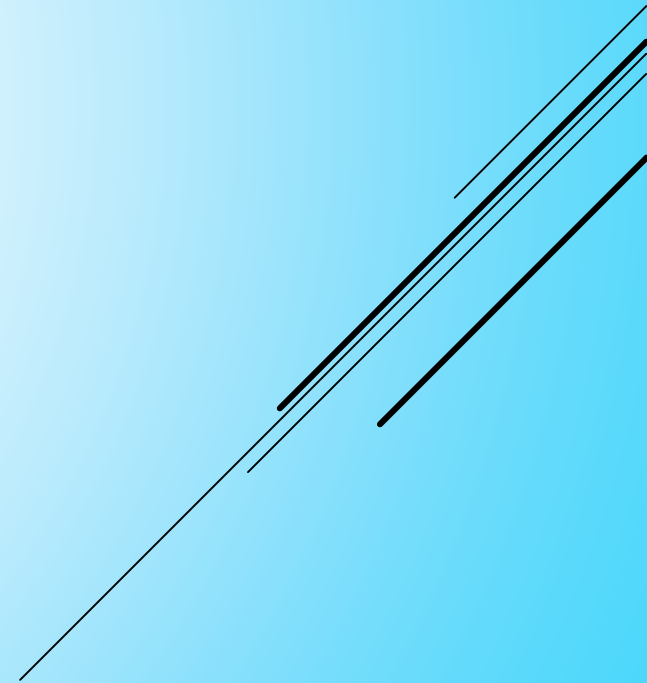
San Diego Unified School District's Reengagement Efforts



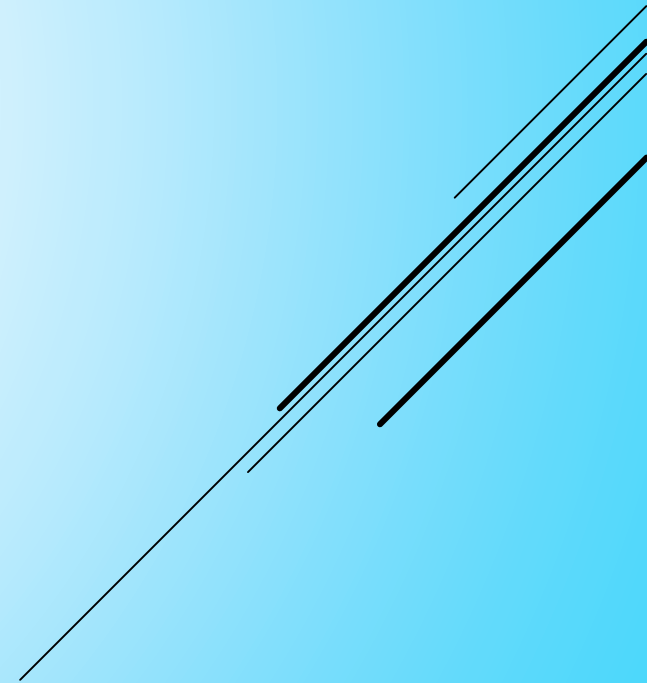
Community Based Reengagement Efforts



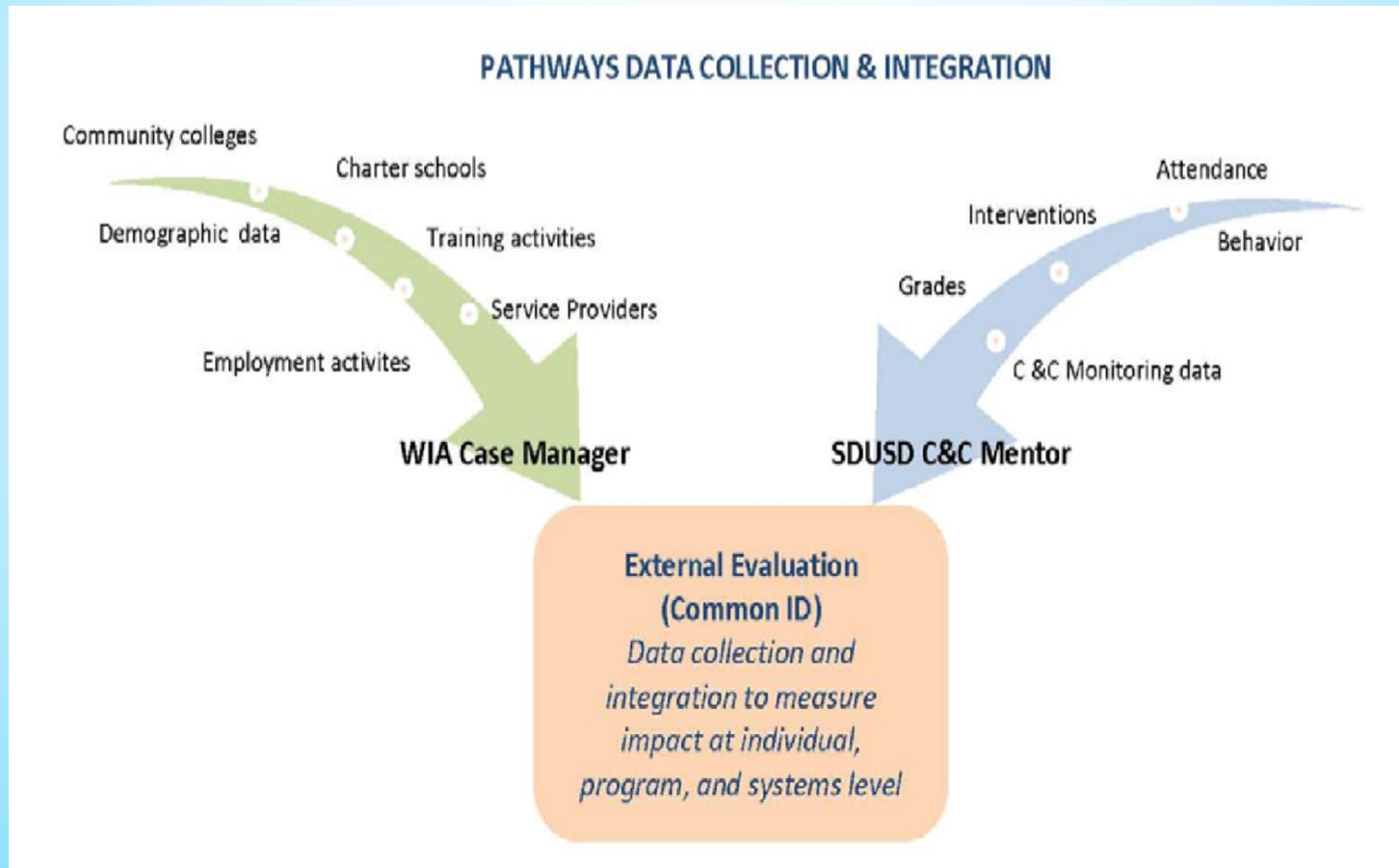

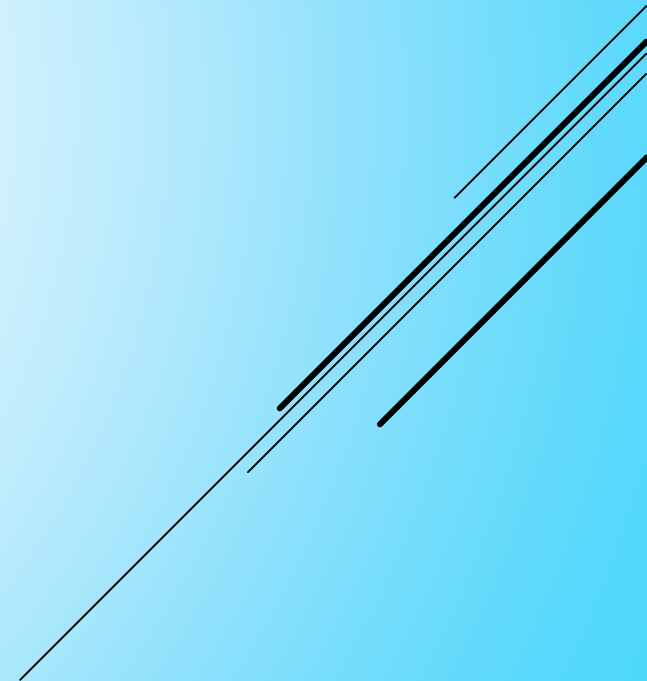

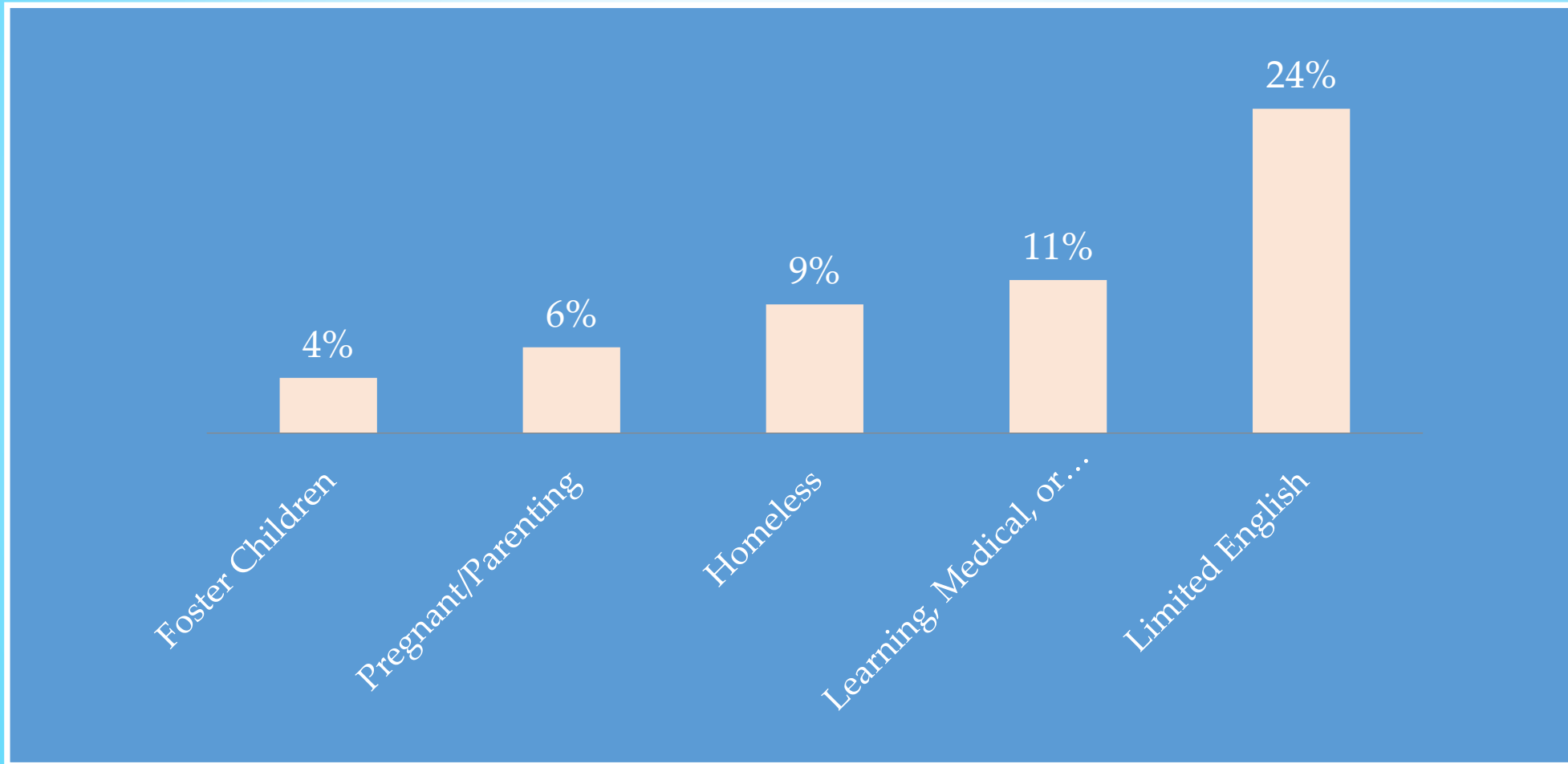


Youth Demographics

- 40 out-of-school youth

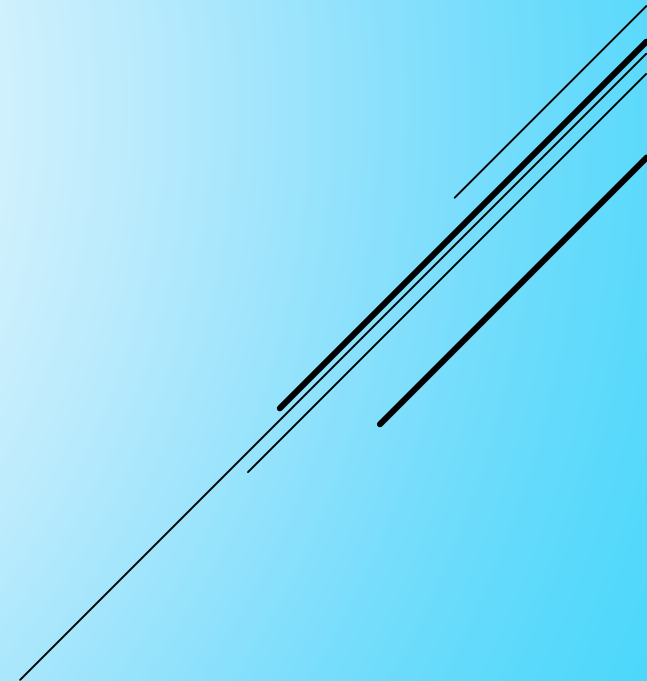


Barriers
